Remembering the Future

Introducing Yizkor

To the outsider, the custom of interrupting our holiday worship to remember the dead must seem, to say the very least, counterproductive. And, indeed, given that the Torah commands us to rejoice on our festivals, it must indeed seem beyond odd of us to invite melancholy, regret, and lingering grief into our sanctuary precisely on those very festive days of which Scripture speaks.

But that question, entirely cogent when asked from the outside, almost answers itself when posed from within. Indeed, for those of us viewing the matter from inside the sanctuary itself, there is only solace and pleasure in taking advantage of the opportunity formally to take note of the presence of the dead, to make heavy with their presence the air in the vault over our heads...and to invite the memories they inspire, not to depress us or to re-open healed wounds, but to inspire us, to encourage us to live our lives fully and nobly just as they did theirs, to grant us solace in the wake of loss not by turning us from the dead, but by turning us toward those whom we have lost and reminding ourselves to be grateful to God for the gift of their lives.

Indeed, the obligation to remember that love, like life itself, is a gift from God is at the core of Yizkor. As we pause to remember, we feel strengthened by our memories and, thus energized, more able than ever to allow the past to propel us through the present into the future. As time falls away and we feel the presence even of ancestors from distant climes and times whom we did not know personally, we step into the bracing stream that is Jewish history itself and feel ennobled by our mortality, not degraded, let alone ruined, by it.

Where exactly the dead reside, who can say? But for the length of our Yizkor Service, their address is here, in this room, in this place, in these hearts. We allow the barriers of logic and reality to fall away as we step into the twin realms of memory and faith. And, like countless Jews who have been doing the same thing for all these many centuries, we too feel comfort born of faith...and courage born of loss.

The Baal Shem Tov once said that remembering is the key to redemption. That comment has been interpreted in a thousand different ways, but its simplest and most satisfying meaning shines through our tears at Yizkor time: it is the notion that by recalling the past, we find the strength to face the future...and that truth applies not only to individuals but to the Jewish people itself, precariously perched between history and destiny, between inception and redemption, and, as ever, between what already has been and what shall one day yet be....

Yizkor in Eden

A High Holiday Midrash

The story of humankind as told in the Torah begins with a riddle. God places Adam in Eden and formally permits him to eat the fruit of every tree present in that place but one, "for on the day you eat of that specific tree," God says unambiguously, "you shall surely die."

Why it is so crucial that Adam not eat any fruit taken from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, Scripture omits to say. But the consequences of doing so are spelled out fully clearly and we, the readers, are left hoping that Adam understands just how big an error it would be to break this one rule that has been given to him to obey.

The rest of the story is well known. The serpent convinces Eve to eat the fruit and then, when nothing appears to happen, she gives it to Adam and he eats it as well. As a result, Adam and Eve are banished from Eden...but the punishment previously decreed—that on the day they eat of the fruit of that forbidden tree they will both

die—is forgotten and never mentioned again. And that, in a nutshell, is the riddle. The text is clear that they will die on the day they eat of the forbidden fruit. But then they do eat the fruit and don't die at all, and live on to become the parents of their children, to find their place in the world, to live into old age together as husband and wife.

The riddle could be solved in many different ways, but the one that lends itself best to contemplation at Yizkor requires reading the story both from our own vantage point and from the vantage point of the personalities depicted in its narrative...and thus to understand that what felt like death to Adam and Eve-leaving paradise, being forced to grow up, to live like adults, to earn a living, to survive in the real world—wasn't actually death at all...at least not to those of us looking on from outside the narrative. The first man and the first woman perceived death to be one thing, but they were wrong: what followed was not oblivion at all but merely a new place, a new version of existence, a new stage. What felt like death to them, in fact, feels like life to us. And that leads us to the comforting question this story appears in Scripture to prompt us to ask:

could it be that, just as what seemed like death to them feels like life to us, could it be that what feels like death to us will feel like life to those looking at *our* narrative from far enough off to see things as they clearly are in this world of dust and mud we inhabit...but can never stand far enough back *from* objectively to see clearly?

Our sages imagined death not as a wall, but as a door; not as a fence, but as a gate in a fence; not as the ultimate barrier between being and nothingness, but as the border between the perceptible and the imperceptible, between knowledge and hope, between this world and the next.

Can moderns embrace such a notion? Trained from childhood to think of death as the ineluctable fate of all who live, can we shuck off the burden of that dismal understanding of things long enough to remember the lesson of Adam and Eve in Paradise? They perceived the gateway through which they had to pass from Eden into the world to be death itself because they couldn't conceive of life outside Eden. They were wrong, of course. But are we? Even to

ask that question requires a certain level of conviction. But to answer it from deep within the wellsprings of faith that animate the Jewish heart at its most responsive to God's presence in the world...that requires not just conviction but true courage.

And it is specifically that courage that Yizkor recurs throughout the year to inspire and to encourage. To think of Adam and Eve as our spiritual forebears seems more than slightly exaggerated. But to learn to face our deepest fears by contemplating their story and the riddle embedded in its detail is not silly or exaggerated at all, but the point of turning to the Torah, the wellspring of spiritual wisdom, for answers to even life's most vexing and troubling questions.

The Yizkor Service

Eternal God, we have come together today to remember people whom we have loved and lost. Grant them a place in Your sheltering presence among the holy and the righteous of every generation.

Before continuing with our private Yizkor prayers, the congregation first joins together communally to remember all those whose names are memorialized on the Yahrtzeit plaques in the Shelter Rock Sanctuary and in the New Hyde Park Jewish Community Center Chapel at Shelter Rock.

Avinu Malkeinu, as faithful members of the House of Israel ever eager to place the needs of the community before our own personal obligations, we begin this day our service of remembrance by praying for those who have no one at all here today to remember them but whose names are memorialized on the walls of our sanctuary and our chapel. Some lived long ago, but others were friends we recall easily and with pleasure. Some lived across the sea, but others were neighbors who lived as close to this building as any of us does. Some died the deaths of martyrs, while others lived long, happy lives that concluded peacefully in advanced old

age. They were all individuals, each possessed of a story, of a specific set of dreams and hopes. Each was a man or a woman possessed of a particular history and a specific destiny. And each has now gone to his or her eternal reward. As a community of caring friends, we acknowledge their role in our lives and the good they did on earth. We miss them and we relish this opportunity to pray that they rest in peace and that their memory serve as a source of ongoing succor and blessing in the lives of their families and their friends near and far, and in all of our own lives as well.
